The following year at the Toronto Convention, Kiwanis International made the following report: "Probably the program of greatest public significance was the observance of "Canadian-United States Days" in accordance with a resolution passed at the Cleveland convention. The period of the observance was set by the Rush-Bagot Agreement, concluded in April 1817, considered probably the most significant historic event from the standpoint of relations between the two countries because it determined the practical disarmament of the Great Lakes and the unfortified border between the two countries. The values in international good will and friendship are inestimable. Nothing that Kiwanis ever did has received greater public recognition and commendation."
