National Boy Scout Week

Ocean Beach Kiwanis Club, at the Tuesday night meeting, observed National Boy Scout week, with Harvey H. Atherton, prominent San Diego Boy Scout leader, as the main speaker. He gave an inspiring, from-the-heart talk on the value of Scouting, and urged the Kiwanians to make a special effort this year to visit meetings of the Boy Scouts of Ocean Beach.

Atherton said that in the 16 years he has been working with Boy Scouts he has never seen a time when there was as much interest in this phase of boy activity as now. "We have 6000 boys and 1400 men active in our San Diego Council area now," he said. "Nationally, one million boys are in scouting now and 10 million have gone through scouting.

"The San Diego Council in the past three years has had the greatest growth in its history.

"But scouting needs manpower. To give money to it is not enough.

"Boys want action, and with our 125 different merit badges, action is what we give them. There is no mystery to boys liking this activity since it is just a natural outlet for a boy's energies."

He gave figures to show among the millions of boys who have been Boy Scouts, the percentage that have become criminals is practically nil.

There is no better way than Boy Scout training to combat and prevent juvenile delinquency, he indicated. Pointing out the need for scouting in this city, he estimated that the city is spending a half million this year for handling juvenile delinquency.

Martin Murphy, Ocean Beach scout leader, was the program chairman and 12 of the scouts of Troop 28 of Ocean Beach were special guests of the club. The 12 were Linden Raney, Jerry Hansen, Walter Turner, Louis Bingham, Ralph Gastellum, Jimmy Hart, Howard Mayfield, Robert Plant, Norman Reese, Larry Dickey, Bert Skinner and Cromer Hubbard.

At the business session, Glenn Jones, 1944 president of the club, was presented with a certificate of merit by Kiwanis International for the achievements of the Ocean Beach club under his direction the past year. Von Marshall of La Mesa, district Lieutenant Governor, made the presentation. Marshall was accompanied to the meeting here by a delegation of La Mesa Kiwanians, including C. H. McNarym, E. H. Lehew and Elmer Drew. Each of the four men was accompanied by his wife.

Another guest at the meeting was Anthony De Pietro of the Shoe Hospital of Ocean Beach. He was a guest of Dr. W. B. Oster.
