Activity report for Past Semester Gentlemen:

This past semester has been one of the finest in the history of the San Diego High School Key Club, which is as you may know, a school service club sponsored by the downtown San Diego Kiwanis Club.

A. ACTIVITIES-

This has been the most active semester in recent years. Among the projects undertaken by the club were:

Kids Day—This day long program presented for the kids of San Diego and sponsored by the Kiwanis Clubs of this area was publicized with fine posters from the Art Service by the Key Club. Posters were distributed to all parts of the city. Twelve members of the Key Club were also on hand during the day, November 20th, to literally load some two thousand kids into speedboats for rides around the bay.

Kiwanis Basketball Tournament—During the course of the tournament, where high school teams from all over Southern California met with our own fine team taking second place behind Beverly Hills, Key Club members distributed and picked up programs at five gyms in this area. In addition the members sold programs and soft drinks in our gym

Clothing Drive—A nation wide clothing drive sponsored by the Save the Children Foundation, was carried out at San Diego High School by the Key Club in cooperation with the Boys' Federation.

Meetings—In an activity unique at San Diego High School, the club held weekly meetings every Thursday morning in the Cafeteria.

B. CONTRIBUTION TO THE SCHOOL—

In addition to representing the school during the aforementioned activities, the Key Club made some definite contribution to the school itself

Song and Yell Sheets—These were distributed by Key Club members at several football games during the season.

Ushered at the Homecoming Assembly—To ensure the success of this wonderful assembly, Key Club members ushered the honored graduates to their places.

C. MEMBERSHIP SIZE—

We have a highly representative membership of nineteen members, containing a good cross-section of the student body at San Diego High School.

D. IMPROVEMENTS-
