"By learning to accept your own death, you lead a much fuller and happier life. Once you realize there is a time limit in which you must accomplish your goals, you begin to live your life more completely," states MRS. SHEILA BENTER, a lecturer on death and dying. She holds a Master's degree with an emphasis in death education, and is having a profound effect on many people's attitudes about death.

In America, she stresses, the attitude toward death has been to deny the subject, and to refuse to talk about it. She emphasizes the importance of accepting our own death in order to clear the path for achieving desires and goals today and not postponing them until tomorrow. Research has shown that people who learn to get in touch with their feelings about death at an early age, live mentally healthier lives. "Live each day to its fullest and make every moment count!" Mrs. Benter, who plans to pursue her doctorate in this area. has transferred these thoughts to youth and adults.

Her knowledge and presentation of this somewhat controversial subject has been met with overwhelming acceptance, not only by her students and their parents, but by her colleagues as well. Her class is creating new and exciting concepts for life and living, with the emphasis on accepting one's own death in order to clear the way for accomplishing goals TODAY and not TOMORROW. Sheila has put her message into action by becoming a marathon runner and dance exercise instructor. She has become living proof of her philosophy.
