

Warns of Danger

The talk given by Lt. Arthur Benoit on "The Danger of War Souvenirs" was a timely one for many serious accidents have occured through the thoughtless handling of "live" ammunition.

Lt. Benoit, who was introduced by Stewart Kendall, exhibited several small souvenirs, so called, to show what should be avoided by citizens not acquainted with the handling of shells, etc.

There will no doubt be many such unexploded pieces found lying around from accidental dropping from planes or from target practice and all should avoid handling such pieces but rather call the authorities to have them removed.

When we were small, it was always preached to us never to aim a gun at any person just in fun, as it might be loaded, and we opine that this is a good suggestion to follow in the attempt to handle any so-called "war souvenirs" for they, too, might be "loaded" and might be deadly in their action in the hands of inexperienced persons.

Several persons have already lost their lives and many more have been badly maimed or perhaps crippled for life through the improper handling of explosives so suggest to your friends and relatives especially your children NOT to touch anything that is foreign to them or resembles a piece of armament or explosive. We can thus do a duty at least in assisting the government authorities to help save lives.


