
NEW MEMBERS' Day next Tuesday Annual event to be surprise program



BULLETIN

For a number of years we have operated a Christmas Bureau for the purpose of preventing duplication of gifts and the spreading of Christmas cheer among as many families and children as possible.

During the war years we have omitted this activity but plan to resume it this year.

The Christmas Bureau will be conducted in the Council Office, Room 101, Community Welfare Building, 645 "A" Street, F-6361. Mrs. Anne T. Swindell, of our staff, will be in charge.

The Christmas Bureau will offer the following services:

(1) Registration of all recipients of Christmas cheer. A card has been prepared for use of all organizations, groups and agencies planning cash, baskets, toys, clothing or to conduct a Christmas party.

Where two or more organizations have the same family on their list, they will be notified of this duplication. The Bureau will assist in clearing the names of children being invited to attend various Christmas functions.

Registration cards are available at the Council Office and all groups are urged to fill out and return the cards not later than December 10. In general, it would seem fair that the first group registering a family, should be given the privilege of serving that family. Hence, it will be to your advantage to get your Christmas registration in early.

Consultation with groups in regard to their Christmas efforts, is another type of service which we are prepared to offer. Some groups are interested in providing gifts that are permanently useful to agencies, or in some cases to families. There is a general tendency toward getting away from the giving of the traditional Christmas Baskets. There are often more constructive ways in which Christmas aid can be given, and we will be glad to offer such counsel as our experience, and that of other cities, may indicate.

The committee has really worked hard to get this under way and at our last meeting the new leader (colored) of the troop was a guest of the Club and Committee and personally invited members and their wives to the organization meeting and induction of the troop.
