Something to work for

International Public Affairs Committee urges change by eliminating unnecessary Government Bureaus

Kiwanis International has all during this wartime period been taking into account the various phases of governmental work and has taken definite stand against those things which have been most flagrant in violation of citizenship right.

At the last council meeting held at Chicago a few days ago, George E. Stringfellow, Chairman of Kiwanis International Public Affairs Committee in a prepared address before that body sternly called for a factual and nonpartisan elimination of Wartime Bureaus of Controls and unnecessary peacetime offices and employees.

In an Asociated Press item from Chicago in the morning's Union, he declared: "Clear distinction should be made between the bureaus which are needed for necessary governmental control and those which were necessary only for wartime functioning or, because of their character, threaten the free enterprise system which is responsible for the nation's pre-eminence."

Committee entitled to much praise and the thanks of the Club.


